- Research progress of the faculty, calendar year wise has been presented, for the last three academic years, enclosed as **Annexure - 2**.
- Students have been actively encouraged to enrol in NPTEL and SWAYAM courses, and the credit transfer mechanism has been implemented in accordance with the prescribed institute academic regulations and guidelines, enclosed as **Annexure - 3**.

Approvals

Consideration and approval of Startup policy.

Principal presented the Startup Policy to the Board for approval, highlighting its importance in view of promoting innovation and entrepreneurship at the institutional level. He mentioned that the policy provides a systematic framework for supporting student and faculty startups, is in line with regulatory and national innovation standards, and increases transparency in processes related to startups. The Board was informed that the policy will further strengthen the innovation ecosystem of the institution and systematically promote the development of entrepreneurial initiatives. Resolution: After elaborated discussions, the board approved the startup policy as enclosed in **Annexure - 4**, and also the constitution of IIC of the institute.

Consideration for approval of MLRS BT25, MT25 and MB25 academic regulations.

The principal presented the academic regulations MLRS-BT25 (B.Tech.), MLRS-MT25 (M. Tech.), and MLRS-MB25 (MBA) and explained the salient changes introduced with reference to MLRS-R24, which include revised credit requirements, early semester registration, full implementation of Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit as per NEP 2020, and the provision of a Full Semester Internship during the VIII Semester of the B.Tech. program.

Academic regulations MLRS-BT25, MT25 and MB25 are enclosed in **Annexure - 5**.

Resolution: The Governing Body approved the academic regulations MLRS-BT25, MLRS-MT25, and MLRS-MB25 for the B.Tech., M. Tech., and MBA programs, applicable from Academic Years 2025-26 admitted students.

- i. Consideration for approval of an increase in intake in B. Tech programs, EEE/ME/CE (from 30 to 60), ECE (90 to 180), M. Tech (CSE) from 06 to 12, and
- ii. New course in M. Tech (Electrical Vehicle Technology) with annual intake of 6 and B. Tech Electronic and Communication Engineering (VLSI Design & Technology)

Resolution:

The Governing Body approved the revised B. Tech and M. Tech intake capacities and the introduction of the M. Tech programme in EEE – Electric Vehicles (EVT). The board is pleased to permit the institute to apply for the changes in the annual intakes for AICTE/ JNTUH/State Govt. from academic year 2026-27

Consider and approval for conducting ISO certifications.

The principal proposed a comprehensive plan for the commencement of the implementation and certification processes of ISO 21001:2018 - "Educational Organizations Management System" EOMS and ISO 9001 - "Quality Management System" QMS with a view to strengthening the quality practices in accordance with globally accepted best practices.

	<p>The principal stated that the implementation of these ISO norms would enable a process-based approach, would improve efficiency, would provide standardized and systematic documentation, and would lay a strong groundwork for continual improvement for both academics and administrative activities.</p> <p>Additionally, it was pointed out that ISO certification would enhance stakeholder satisfaction, risk-based thinking, governance and accountability, and cement the institution's commitment to outcome-based education, quality assurance, and regulatory compliance.</p> <p>After extensive deliberation, the Governing Body has realized the importance of ISO certification in boosting the transparency and excellence of performance and has approved the commencement of the ISO certification process.</p> <p>The detailed proposal is attached as Annexure – 6.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board considered and approved the proposal to proceed with ISO certification processes, acknowledging their significance in advancing institutional quality and compliance.</p>
<p>Item No. 6</p>	<p>Consideration and approval for Full-Semester Internship Policy. The principal presented the Full-Term Internship Policy to the Board for approval, emphasizing that the policy would further strengthen the industry-academia linkage and enhance experiential learning among students. He also explained that, to facilitate the full-term internship, students are required to complete the prescribed VIII Semester subjects in advance by opting for them as accelerated courses, as per the approved academic framework. The policy has been framed within the ambit of applicable regulatory guidelines, ensures transparency in implementation, and is aimed at enhancing career readiness and employability of students.</p> <p>The Full Semester Internship Policy is enclosed as Annexure – 7.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board approved the Full-Term Internship Policy as presented, recognizing that it is in line with institutional and regulatory standards and contributes to industry-oriented learning.</p>
<p>Item No. 7</p>	<p>Consideration and approval for procurement of new equipment for B. Tech 2025, M. Tech 2025, and MBA 2025 batches. The principal presented the requirement for procurement of new equipment to support the academic and laboratory needs of the B. Tech, M. Tech, and MBA batches for the academic year 2025. He emphasized that the proposed procurement is aligned with the prescribed curriculum, would strengthen the Institute's practical learning infrastructure, and complies with applicable regulatory and accreditation requirements.</p> <p>Further, the Principal informed the Governing Body about the proposed establishment of laboratories for the M. Tech (Electric Vehicles) program, namely:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Battery Management Systems Laboratory 2. Electric Vehicle Laboratory 3. Powertrain Architecture Laboratory 4. Communication Protocols Laboratory <p>An estimated budget of Rs. 15,00,000/- is proposed for the above purpose, and approval of the Governing Body was sought accordingly.</p> <p>The list of proposed equipment is attached as Annexure – 8.</p>

	<p>Resolution: The Board reviewed and approved the procurement of the proposed equipment for the B. Tech 2025, M. Tech 2025, and MBA 2025 batches to strengthen academic delivery and laboratory readiness.</p>
Item No. 8	<p>Consideration and approval for allowing parents to view external examination papers within a limited time frame. The principal proposed a mechanism to allow parents to view external examination papers within a defined timeframe of one week, aimed at enhancing transparency and fostering trust in the assessment process. He emphasized that this initiative would be carried out under controlled conditions, ensuring confidentiality, integrity of records, and compliance with examination regulations.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board considered and approved the proposal to permit parents to view external examination papers within a specified timeframe, subject to adherence to institutional guidelines and examination protocols.</p>
Item No. 9	<p>Consideration and approval for Introducing of Minor Programs in Defense Technology and Quantum Computing. The Board considered the proposal to introduce Minor Programs in Defense Technology and Quantum Computing, noting that these programs align with emerging technological needs and are intended to enhance students' interdisciplinary skills and career opportunities. It was further resolved that the programs shall be implemented after obtaining the necessary approval from AICTE, and thereafter conducted in accordance with the prescribed regulatory guidelines.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board considered and approved.</p>
Item No. 10	<p>Consideration and approval for Student Learning Support and Enrichment policy. The principal informed the Board members that the Academic Slow Learners' Policy has been developed to provide support for students requiring additional academic assistance. He explained that the policy includes early identification, remedial classes, and continuous monitoring, and presented it to the Board for consideration and approval. The Academic slow learner's policy is enclosed as Annexure – 9.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board considered and approved the Academic Slow Learners' Policy.</p>
Item No. 11	<p>Consideration and approval for online evaluation of CIA examinations and providing the evaluated scripts to the parents for one week through student login. The principal informed the Governing Body that the institution proposes to implement online evaluation of the Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) examinations and to make the evaluated answer scripts available to parents for a period of one week through the student login facility. The rationale behind this is to enable the parent institution engagement and enhance transparency in the evaluation process.</p> <p>Resolution: The Board noted and acknowledged.</p>

These centers are aimed at implementing high-end research, fostering innovation, and encouraging inter-disciplinary collaboration. It substantially enhances the capabilities of the institute in frontier and futuristic technologies.

Item No. 21

Establishment of the Haritha Vahan.

The principal further updated the members that Haritha Vahan is about renovating old, used electric vehicles to make available an affordable eco-friendly mode of transportation. He explained that the project would involve testing, repairing, and restoring used EVs to ensure reliable performance. He further highlighted that this initiative will contribute to a reduction in electronic waste and enhancement in best practices, besides opportunities for students to learn. The resources required and basic plan of implementation were briefly shared with the members, and the importance of the same was highlighted in terms of strengthening green transportation within the campus.
